All Kansas infants and toddlers (birth to age 3) are entitled to a **free** developmental evaluation to determine if they are eligible for early intervention services.



Who we are.

Our mission is to support Kansas families with infants or toddlers experiencing developmental delays or disabilities so every child can learn, grow, and achieve their fullest potential.

Through a network of programs, we serve the entire state, so all Kansas residents can access Infant Toddler Services wherever they live.

We operate under the national Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA – Part C) to provide screening, evaluation, and early intervention services at no cost to Kansas children (birth to age 3) who experience developmental delays or disabilities.

How to get started.

Step 1: Find the Infant Toddler Services of Kansas program in the family's area (visit www.itsofks.org) and request a *free* developmental evaluation for the child.

Step 2: A Family Service Coordinator and/ or licensed Early Intervention Professional will schedule a home visit to evaluate the child and speak with family and caregivers.

Step 3: If the evaluation team identifies a developmental delay or the child has a diagnosis known to impact development, the child may be eligible to receive services at no cost until age 3.
